Year 6 Farewell Dinner/Disco - Thursday 13 Dec.





CARES Bike Education Day for Year 5 & 6



The Program is funded by Gosford City Council, Wyong Shire Council, the Roads and Traffic

Authority and the Department of Transport and Regional Services. It is staffed by police from the Brisbane Water and Tuggerah Local Area Commands and designed to educate primary school students about bicycle safety and maintenance and increase student skill development and awareness of general road rules.

UNIFORM REPORT:

Lynley Woolley suggested having a competition with a school backpack as a prize. Students can pay to guess the number of lollies in a jar. The student with the nearest correct response win the lollies and a backpack. Lynley will organize a flyer with the competition details. It was noted that there are about 70 library bags in stock! It seems unlikely that that such a large number will be sold. Karen S suggested donating 20 or so bags to the library to be given as library awards to students at Mrs Gallagher's discretion. The price for remaining bags to be reduced to \$2.00. The mark up policy for uniforms is 5%. Summer shorts for girls, need some samples and a survey of parent opinion on this potential option.

CANTEEN REPORT:

The Country Fair

Any donations of cakes to the school, for the fair, will be collected by Karen S on Friday. The school will notify Karen. Deb $\mathcal C$ will buy 30 litres of milk and will deliver it to Rosa on Friday, who has kindly agreed to store it in her cool room and deliver it to the fair. Kylie will collect the slushie machines from Sydney on Friday. Kylie and Lynette will start setting up Friday afternoon and early Saturday morning.

Burritos are hugely popular, but are labour intensive to prepare, and not that profitable.

PRINCIPAL'S REPORT:

- Terrigal Beach excursion bus cost will be \$470 dollars. P&C have agreed to pay for the bus.
- Enrolments are still 9 short of the number of students required to retain all of our teachers. CMPS will lose one teacher.

- Year 6 Farewell; Linton Gardens quoted 41,435 for 41 people, which is about \$35 per child. It was decided that this was too expensive, so the venue will be the Memorial Golf Club. The cost to the students will be \$10 each, with the P&C paying the difference. Jacky Sidiropoulos has kindly agreed to make the cake. Kylie F has offered to organize the balloons and glitter on behalf of the P&C.
- The school needs a stage for the end of year concert. Last year it cost over \$900 to hire. Wondering about the feasibility of the school purchasing a stage, or having one made by local volunteers. The latter option may raise OH&S issues. The stage needs to be about 7 x 4 metres and 1 metre high.
- Gosford City Council have requested the lodging of any objections by the school to the removal of trees by a neighbouring property's building proposal. Deb C to view the proposal.
- P&C have agreed to purchase sport and book vouchers for the School's presentation awards.

TREASURER'S REPORT:

The closing balance is \$7,478. Approximately \$2,568 will be needed to pay for bills.

The next meeting is on Wednesday, 28 November, in the school library. The meeting time will be 3 for 3.15 start.
