Being a bystander to bullying

When bullying is happening and you are there, then you have four choices.

- 1. Stand and watch
- 2. Support the bully
- 3. Get away from there



An 'Up Stander' will

use words and/or actions that can help someone who is being bullied.



What can you do?

1. Make it clear to your friends that you won't be involved in bullying behaviour

- 2. Never stand by and watch or encourage bullying behaviour
- 3. Do not harass, tease or spread gossip about others, this includes on social networking sites
- 4. Never forward on or respond to messages or photos that may be offensive or upsetting
- 5. Support the person who is being bullied to ask for help e.g. go with them to a place they can get help or provide them with information about where to go for help
- 6. Report it to someone in authority or someone you trust e.g. parent, at school to a teacher7. Get Help
