Selective high school placement process in 2020

Applications for Year 7 entry to selective high schools in 2022 are now open. Applications will close on 16 November 2020.

Parents can apply online at https://education.nsw.gov.au/public-schools/selective-high-schools-and-opportunity-classes/year-7.

All applicants are required to sit the Selective High School Placement Test to be held on Thursday 11 March 2021. The department has introduced a new application system that will give parents a more interactive experience. The new system enables parents to make updates and add attachments even after an application is submitted. Parents can also communicate directly with the High Performing Students Team through the system's new 'messages' feature.

Primary Evacuation Refuge: Kariong High School

Secondary Evacuation Location: Wyong High School

Shelter in Place Location: Admin building (secondary SIP is Peats Ridge Hall if safe/enough time/road access etc. and able to travel all together in one trip)

On days of Severe Bushfire Rating or higher

- o Brief staff in morning huddle and ensure students bring their bags indoors
- Have emergency kit ready with rolls, first aid kit, medications, drinking water, Bushfire Plan, torch and spare batteries, radio with spare batteries etc.
- Ensure all bins are moved away from buildings (where not possible, close lids of bins)
- Place hoses in strategic locations around the premises and ensure tap handles are attached (close to where sheltering in place)

Response – Actions to take if concerned about the threat of fire

- 1) Sound alarm and move all staff, students and visitors to the Shelter in place location (Admin building)
- 2) Call 000 to notify of fire
- 3) Take emergency kit with rolls, first aid kit, medications, drinking water, Bushfire Plan, torch, megaphone, radio and spare batteries etc. to the Shelter in Place location
- 4) Call the H&S Hotline XXXXXXX (option 1) to advise and for support in deciding whether to evacuate or shelter in place (if no mobile reception, use Secured Comms app to notify of your whereabouts and actions being taken)
- 5) Call DEL
