COVID Measures



The theme of Science week is glass – more than meets the eye.

Glass is massively important in our world and particularly in applications of Science. Our entire telecommunications industry depends on glass through optical fibres to transmit billions of streams of data each second. Then of course glass is used in scientific containers, microscopes, telescopes, lenses, televisions, scientific equipment, windows etc.

The students will take part in 5 scientific activities where once again they will be taught by the year 9 selective science students.

A feature of our science week activities is the expo evening from 6pm to 7.30pm on Wednesday 31st August. We invite families to come and view the projects that our selective science students are submitting in the Young Scientist Awards competition and view the displays setup by the primary schools.
